MEET A PARISH COUNCILLOR FOR WINKFIELD (ASCOT PRIORY WARD)

The clerk interviewed Councillor Dorothy Hayes MBE on a boiling hot day in July and couldn't possibly do justice to the information learned or the experiences of this treasured Councillor of 35 years.

From a Planning Dispute to Public Service

Dot and her husband moved to the area in 1989 and put in a planning application to make changes to their home. They were refused but not to be easily beaten, Dot fought and won. She then considered how many local residents might struggle with the complexities of planning and was inspired to get involved. Dot is keen to keep the focus on serving the community and is happy if she can turn in for the night knowing that she has been of help to someone.

Over the years

As well as being an active Councillor for Winkfield Parish Council, Councillor Hayes is also a long-serving Bracknell Forest Councillor and was twice Mayor of the Borough from 2001-2003. She also dedicated 24 years to the Valuation Tribunal for England. Her contribution was honoured in 2005, when the Lord Lieutenant of Berkshire nominated her for an MBE for services to the people and community of Bracknell Forest. Dot shared some highlights including the installation of giant poppies to commemorate the Great War, advocating and supporting planning for Lapland UK and supporting rollout of life-saving defibrillators in the parish.

Dot is looking ahead to Winkfield Council making positive improvements to the Ascot Jubilee site and would love to see more engagement with young people. She is a firm believer that residents of all ages should be able to live in a safe and secure environment and will strive to uphold this commitment.

Music – "Dot Most"

Outside of council, Dot has been active for many years in the music industry. Her husband, known in the industry as Dave Most, working with his brother Mickie Most was a well-known producer and promoter. Known as Dot Most, she helped bring about the legendary Radio 1 Roadshows and worked with her husband in the music industry. They worked closely with the Bee Gees and developed a close professional and personal bond.

Great poppies mark Great War

A field of two metre high poppies have been planted at locations across Bracknell Forest to commemorate the centenary of the First World War.

The first of 25 super-sized poppies, made of metal and fibre glass, have been installed by council contractor Ringway for Bracknell Forest Council at a number of roundabouts in the borough.

Cllr Mrs Dorothy Hayes, executive member for the environment, said: "These striking pieces of art will remind residents and those passing through Bracknell Forest of the brave men and women who lost their lives in the Great War. "But they will also bring to mind the essential work of the British Legion in helping and supporting veterans of more recent wars."

HELPING HEDGEHOGS THRIVE IN OUR COMMUNITY

Hedgehogs are one of Britain's best-loved wild animals, but their numbers have declined by over 29 million since 1950. In the UK, there are thought to be fewer than one million left, and they're vulnerable to extinction due to habitat loss, busy roads, and changes in gardening practices.

The good news is that simple actions by local residents can make a real difference.

Small changes made by many households can have a big impact. By providing food and water, creating wildlife-friendly gardens and helping hedgehogs move safely through our community, we can all play a part in protecting one of Britain's most cherished animals.

With a little help from local residents, hedgehogs can continue to be a welcome sight in our parish for many years to come.

Food and Water - One of the easiest ways to help hedgehogs is to provide a shallow dish of fresh water, particularly during warm or dry weather. Water is often harder for wildlife to find than food, and a reliable source can be invaluable.

If you would like to provide supplementary food, meaty cat or dog food is suitable. Special hedgehog food is also available. Please avoid offering milk, as hedgehogs are lactose intolerant and it can make them ill. Bread should also be avoided as it has little nutritional value.

Make Your Garden Hedgehog-Friendly - Hedgehogs can travel long distances each night in search of food, shelter and mates. However, fences and walls can prevent them from moving freely. Creating a small 13cm x 13cm (5-inch) gap at the base of a fence allows.

IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY THIS SUMMER!

What's happening?

Winkfield Parish Council is progressing important improvements at several sites throughout the Parish so that the facilities remain safe, modern and enjoyable for everyone.

At Ascot Jubilee Recreation Ground on Goaters Road, the zip wire and swings, which had been decommissioned for safety reasons are now being upgraded.

- In March 2026 council agreed to begin a wider improvement project for the site
- The local community told us that they wanted the play equipment for older children to be replaced as soon as possible, so in May 2026 council agreed do this outside of the larger project, which will take longer to complete.
- Tender documents from five play equipment companies were reviewed early in July; a contractor to carry out these works will be approved by Council on 21st July.
- Installation is expected during September, with further updates to follow as the wider plans for Ascot Jubilee develop.

Winkfield Parish Council invited eight play equipment companies to review a Play Value Report on the **playground at Carnation Hall on Chavey Down Road** and come up with ideas on improvements to the playground. Council agreed a shortlist of three designs to be presented to the public. This was done via Facebook and face-to-face sessions with regular users of the playground. A vote was conducted and one design emerged as the clear favourite: HAGS Ltd has been appointed to carry out these works which we hope will be completed over the summer holidays.

In March, council considered and agreed to a proposal to contract a Chartered Surveyor to progress works to refurbish, clean and maintain **Martins Heron & The Warren Community Centre on Whitton Road**. Four main contractors were approached and Steel & Co have been appointed for the works, under the direction of project management by Stockton Bradley. Heras fencing and signs will go up around the building this summer, and some nearby parking bays will be blocked out for contractors. We are looking forward to seeing a much brighter, fresher community centre once the works are completed at the end of August.

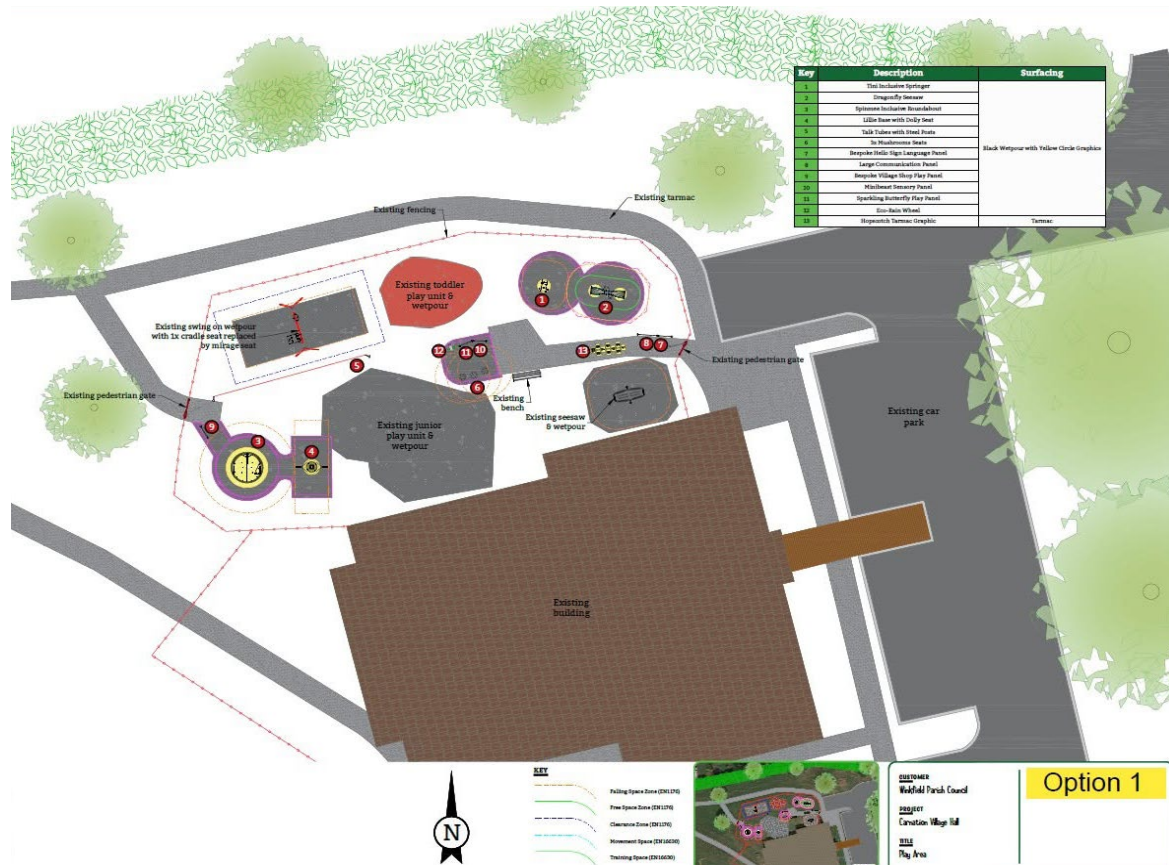


Figure 2: The selected design for Carnation Hall playground

THE BURGoyNE SEAT

The Burgoyne Seat was erected in 1934 in memory of Marie Henrietta Johanna Burgoyne (1849 - 1934) by her son, Cuthbert John Burgoyne under an Oak tree at the crossroads of Windsor Road, Sunninghill Road, Mounts Hill and Sunninghill Road. She lived in Broadlands, Sunningdale and died in Woodside by Ascot Racecourse. The crossroads was modified in 1970 to become the Fernhill (or otherwise known as "Kidney" or "Peanut" roundabout) with the seat under the Oak tree now in the middle of the roundabout. Unfortunately, the seat was demolished by a Mercedes car late one night and remained in that condition for several years until an Ascot resident, Elizabeth Comish had the idea of saving and reconstructing it at the Offices of Winkfield Parish Council on Fernbank Road. Elizabeth enlisted the help of BFC and WPC staff to recover the remains of the seat. It could not be rebuilt as a seat but Elizabeth created a planter with what was left. The Burgoyne family became the largest Australian wine importers and were later taken over by Hardys Wines/Pernod and are now part of the Vinarchy group.

The inscription from the brothers and the Burgoyne Coat of Arms are still visible.

DEMOCRACY IN WINKFIELD



In 1894, the Local Government Act introduced elected councils at district and parish levels. As the tier of local government closest to the people a parish council is uniquely positioned to represent and respond to the needs of local communities.

Established under this legislation, Winkfield Parish Council was formed and has been serving the community ever since. It has seen its responsibilities grow and now, in 2026 the council is committed to delivering the following core services:

Maintaining the parish environment – Managing 9609 acres of parish land;

Managing recreational facilities – Overseeing eight playgrounds, four community halls and two allotments sites;

Statutory planning consultation – Evaluating and submitting observations on local planning applications, totalling 152 reviews in 2025–26 financial year;

Running community events – Ensuring that diverse events are offered, including the Annual Cycle Ride, Summer of Fun Day, Arts Week, Silver

Sunday and Footpath Walks;

Providing grants to voluntary organisations – Administering a budget of up to £48,000 for 2026 under relevant statutory powers such as the Local Government Act, Section 137.

Elected Representatives

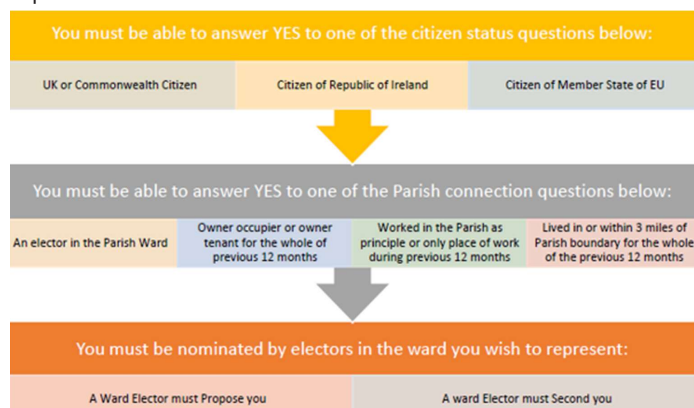
Winkfield Parish Council consists of 19 elected councillors who represent four local wards:

- Ascot Priory
- Martins Heron & The Warren with Swinley Forest,
- Forest Park,
- Winkfield & Cranbourne

The council's operations are managed by administrative, grounds and facilities teams led by the Parish Clerk & Responsible Finance Officer.

The Election Process – Eligibility

To be eligible to be a councillor you must meet the criteria below, which ensures that representatives have a parish connection.



Why Become a Councillor?

Community Impact – to make a difference in local quality of life.

Advocacy – To represent community interests and address local needs like parks, services, or safety.

Diverse Perspectives – to bring diverse skills and unique life experience, including professional work experience, volunteering, caring, or community involvement.

And Politics?

Parish councils are not politically affiliated and councillors do not need to have political experience; it's about engaging with the local community and working as a team with other councillors to the benefit of the entire parish.

Elections

Following a request from at least ten local residents, recent elections were held in our Forest Park ward. This saw four members of the public nominated and following a vote managed by Bracknell Forest Council, a new councillor was elected. Local Government election will take place in May 2027 when all seats will be open for nomination. If you are passionate about your community and to drive local change, you could consider becoming a councillor and being nominated. Alternatively, you could participate in supporting the ongoing work of the council by voting. Your vote directly shapes the future of the parish.

Everyone is encouraged to vote so that their voice is heard – this could be directly at your local polling station, by post or by proxy (where you ask someone to vote on your behalf). It is important to know that the law now requires voters to show photographic ID – if you don't have one you can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate online at [Apply for photo ID to vote \(called a 'Voter Authority Certificate'\) - GOV.UK](#)

Community Engagement

If you are a local resident and would like to find out more please check our website, follow our Facebook page or come to a meeting. Our meetings are open to everyone and there is a public participation section at the start of most meetings for you to ask questions or tell us anything about items which are on the agenda.

In the 130th year since the formation of Winkfield Parish Council, a new residents' forum – the Winkfield 130 – was formed as a structured consultation mechanism to share feedback on key issues. Members of the forum receive just 3–4 emails per year seeing their views, so it's a small commitment but makes a big difference to the parish.

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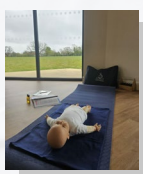
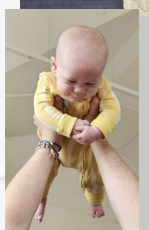
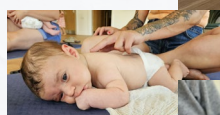
